Greetings to our friends and benefactors,

The Birchwood Area Food Pantry is happy to report that our grant application to the Rice Lake Community Health Foundation (RLCHF) was recently approved. The grant matches \$1.50 for every \$1.00 that we raise to a maximum of \$10,000 -- meaning that if we can raise \$6,666.67 by year-end, we will receive \$10,000 from the RLCHF. If you can help us with a donation, now is a perfect opportunity to make a huge impact. Many organizations, such as ours, struggled throughout the pandemic and now face economic challenges brought upon by ever-increasing food prices. The need of food for our clients continues, and demand is increasing significantly. Currently, 1 out of 9 adults and 1 out of 7 children in NW Wisconsin are food insecure. Over the past 48 years, we have continually provided nutritious food ensuring balanced meals to those we serve. And, we are always seeking to improve our current programs and develop new programs to educate our families on creative ways to best utilize the food we provide.

We feel blessed to be able to provide food to those in our community(s) in their time of food insecurity. We couldn't accomplish this task without your generous support and our legion of volunteers who give of their time and talent.
