We are two months into our fiscal year and it is time to bring you up to date on the many activities taking place at the Birchwood Area Food Pantry (BAFP). The demand for food is increasing as Pandemic relief has been drastically reduced and the price of groceries has risen. We are also continually welcoming new clients into our facility and we are currently serving more than 33 families at each distribution. To ease volunteer workload, we are returning to twice-a-month truck deliveries in July and will add a third monthly distribution (4th Monday of each month) as soon as we can find someone to coordinate the distribution. We are always looking for new leaders and this might be an opportunity for you. Finally, we have recently named a committee to complete a grant request to the Rice Lake Community Health Foundation.
